RULES OF SHOW

The Show will be judged in accordance with the rules and classifications of the American Rose Society by accredited and Apprentice Judges. The official A.R.S. scale of points will be used. Any award may be withheld at the discretion of the judges whose decision will be final.

Exhibits will be judged on the basis of their condition at the time of judging. Each entry must be correctly named. One bloom per stem must be exhibited disbudded. Evidence of recent disbudding will be subject to penalization. Length of stem and size of bloom should be proportional.

This show is an open show. All classes are open to ALL exhibitors, except those in Section N (open only to judges judging this show), and Section O (open only to those who have never won an award at any show conducted under A.R.S. Rules).

Exhibitor registration is free. Both portions of tags must be completed with name, address, section and class. Only A.R.S. entry tags will be used (available at show time for exhibitors who do not have their own).

Roses may be placed for exhibition between 7:00 AM and 11:00 AM, SUNDAY, JUNE 13, 2010 at Parmatown Mall. Exhibitors may place their own entries but may not touch or move any other entry. Roses presented for entry after 11:00 AM will be placed but not judged.

All specimen roses must be grown by the exhibitor in his/her private outdoor garden.

All specimen roses become the property of the Western Reserve Rose Society.

Containers for all specimen classes will be furnished by the Western Reserve Rose Society.

Only judges, clerks, and show committee persons are permitted within the show area during judging.

Material may be added to the containers to hold roses upright but must not extend above the neck of the container.

*No ribbon or certificate may be removed until the close of the show. Ribbons and certificates will be presented at the **Western Reserve Rose Society's JULY 27, 2010 meeting**. Ribbons and certificate will be mailed to out-of-town exhibitors who provide the Show Committee with a mailing envelope and appropriate postage.*

Name, classification, and color classification will be in accordance with the current American Rose Annual, Handbook for Selecting Roses, American Rose Magazine, or Modern Roses and Supplements and Dobson's Guide.

Classes can be established, changed, combined, or deleted without notice by the Show Chairperson to preserve the integrity of the show.

Section A: HYBRID TEA AND GRANDIFLORA

This section will be judged alphabetically within each class.
Each cultivar will be a sub-class.

QUEEN – KING – PRINCESS – and 3 Courts from Class 1, Class 26 and 42
Class 1 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora -- One bloom per stem

Class 2 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora spray -- One stem with two or more blooms

Section B: FLORIBUNDAS

Class 3 Floribunda, One bloom -- No side buds permitted

Class 4 Floribunda, spray -- One stem with two or more blooms

Section C: CHALLENGE CLASSES

Class 5 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora -- Three of a Kind, three blooms, all the same cultivar, each one bloom per stem

Class 6 Hybrid Tea and/or Grandiflora -- Three Different, three blooms, each a distinct different cultivar, each one bloom per stem

Class 7 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora - Cycle of Bloom, three hybrid teas or grandifloras, each one bloom per stem -- same cultivar in three stages of bloom: One bud, one exhibition stage, one full-blown

**Class 8 Mixed Class -- One Hybrid Tea, one bloom per stem -
One Grandiflora, one bloom per stem or multiple blooms -
One Floribunda Spray, one stem with two or more blooms**

Section D: CLIMBERS

Class 9 *Large-Flowered Climber and Hybrid Wichurana*

One Stem -- One bloom per stem or multiple bloom

NOTE: This class is for roses registered as:

Large-Flowered Climber (LCL) or Hybrid Wichurana (HWich) only.

Section E: SHRUBS

Class 10 *Classic Shrub, One Stem -- One bloom per stem or multiple bloom*

NOTE: Includes Hybrid Kordesiiis, Hybrid Moyesiis,
Hybrid Musks and Hybrid Rugosas.

Class 11 *Modern Shrub, One Stem -- One bloom per stem or multiple bloom*

NOTE: Those registered as (S) and includes "English" roses by David Austin.

Section F: OLD GARDEN ROSES

Class 12 *Genesis Rose. Any named biological species ("wild") roses, which is so classified by the ARS and so identified in its publication; one bloom or spray*

Class 13 *Dowager Roses. Any named hybrid variety of Old Garden Rose, introduced prior to 1867; one bloom or spray*

Class 14 *Victorian Roses. Any named hybrid variety of Old Garden Rose, introduced 1867 or later, or with unknown date of introduction, one bloom or spray*

PLEASE PUT DATE OF INTRODUCTION ON ENTRY TAG

NOTE: Old Garden Roses are Alba, Ayrshire, Bourbons, Boursalt, Centifolias, Chinas, Climbing Teas, Damasks, Hybrid Albas, Hybrid Bracteata, Hybrid Chinas, Hybrid Eglanteria, Hybrid Foetidas, Hybrid Gallicas, Hybrid Perpetuals, Hybrid Sempervirens, Hybrid Setigera, Hybrid Spinossismas, Mosses, Noistettes, Portlands, Species and Teas. Old Garden Roses also include species hybrids introduced prior to 1867.

Section G: SINGLE-PETALED ROSES

Class 15 *Single-Petaled or Semi-Double Rose -- 12 petals or less, one stem with one bloom only, any classification except Miniature*

Section H: ROSE BOWL

Class 16 *One Bloom -- Any classification except Miniature, Exhibition stage, NO foliage ONE ENTRY PER EXHIBITOR*

Section I: FULL-BLOWN

Class 17 *Hybrid Tea and/or Grandiflora -- A mature, open bloom showing stamens, one bloom per stem*

Section J: FRAGRANCE

Class 18 *Any Named Variety -- One bloom per stem to be judged solely on scent*

Section K: POLYANTHAS

Class 19 *Polyantha Spray -- One stem with two or more blooms*

Section L: ENGLISH BOX

Class 20 *Any different, same or combination of six named varieties, hybrid teas or grandifloras -- one entry per garden (one box provided by club)*

Section M: BOUTONNIERE

Class 21 *Any rose suitable for display in a coat (miniature excluded) -- one entry per garden*

Section N: JUDGES (OPEN ONLY TO THOSE JUDGING THIS SHOW WHO MAY ENTER AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF CULTIVARS. THIS SECTION WILL BE JUDGED ALPHABETICALLY WITHIN EACH CLASS. EACH CULTIVAR WILL BE A SUB-CLASS.)

ONE "BEST OF SHOW" WILL BE AWARDED WITHIN THE JUDGES SECTION (includes Classes 22, 23, 24 & 25)

Class 22 *Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora – One stem with one bloom*

Class 23 *One Spray - Any classification except miniature*

Class 24 *Miniature or Miniflora - One stem with one bloom*

Class 25 *Miniature or Miniflora - One spray*

Section O: **NOVICES**

(OPEN ONLY TO THOSE WHO HAVE NEVER WON AN AWARD AT ANY SHOW CONDUCTED UNDER AMERICAN ROSE SOCIETY RULES -- THREE ENTRIES PER EXHIBITOR!)

Class 26 *Any Cultivar -- One bloom, any cultivar (Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora)*

Class 27 *Any Cultivar -- One spray, any cultivar (Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora)*

Class 28 *Any Cultivar -- One bloom, any cultivar (miniature or miniflora)*

Class 29 *Any Cultivar -- One spray, any cultivar (miniature or miniflora)*

Section P: **MINIATURES and MINIFLORAS**

This section will be judged alphabetically within each class.
Each cultivar will be a sub-class.

QUEEN – KING – PRINCESS – and 3 Court from Class 30, 28 and 42

Class 30 *Miniature and Miniflora -- One Bloom per stem*

Class 31 *Miniature and Miniflora -- Miniature, single or semi-double flower (12 or fewer petals), one stem with one bloom.*

Section Q: **MINIATURE and MINIFLORA SPRAYS**

This section will be judged alphabetically within each class.
Each cultivar will be a sub-class.

Class 32 *Miniature and Miniflora -- One Spray, one stem with two or more blooms*

Section R: **MINIATURE and MINIFLORA CHALLENGE CLASSES**

Class 33 *Miniature and Miniflora -- Three of a kind, three blooms, all the same cultivar, each one bloom per stem*

Class 34 *Miniature and Miniflora -- Three different kinds, all different cultivar, each one bloom per stem*

Class 35 *English Box - Miniature and Miniflora - Any same, different or combination of six named varieties, miniature or miniflora -- one entry per garden (one box provided by club)*

Class 36 *Miniature and Miniflora -- Cycle of Bloom, three miniatures, each one bloom per stem. Same cultivar in three stages of bloom:
 ONE BUD -- ONE EXHIBITION STAGE -- ONE FULL BLOWN*

Class 37 **Miniature and Miniflora** -- Rose Bowl, one bloom, exhibition stage, no foliage. One Entry Per Exhibitor

Class 38 **Miniature and Miniflora** -- Full-Blown, a mature, open bloom showing stamens. One Bloom Per Stem

Class 39 **Miniature and Miniflora** – Picture Frame, one bloom at exhibition stage with no foliage showing

Section S: CLUB CATEGORY

RESTRICTED TO WESTERN RESERVE ROSE SOCIETY MEMBERS ONLY

Class 40 **HIGH/LOW** - One hybrid tea, grandiflora, floribunda, climber, shrub or old garden bloom (large rose) and one miniature or miniflora bloom (small rose), same coloration and form.

Section T: UNIDENTIFIED VARIETIES

Class 41 Any unidentified variety, one bloom or spray, entered without a name. This class is for any roses, which the exhibitor has been unable to identify. The public is particularly invited to bring roses for this class. Judges and Consulting Rosarians present will attempt to establish the identity of roses entered in this class, as a service to the exhibitors.

Section U: SMALL GARDEN – gardens of 25 roses or less

Class 42 Any one bloom, any variety or type

Section V: LANDSCAPE ROSE

Class 43 Any one bloom or spray of any variety of Landscape Rose (includes Knockout Roses)
